WHAT TO DO

From art exhibits to PoliticalFest to pop-ups, fascinating events are aplenty during the Convention. Even better: they're all kid-friendly, so you and your family can make a day of it.

POLITICALFEST

JULY 22 - JULY 27 10am - 6pm daily

ODNKEYS AROUND TOWN

An art installation consisting of 57 FIBERGLASS DONKEYS, each painted by a local artist to represent the 50 states, five U.S. territories, Washington D.C., and Democrats abroad, "Donkeys Around Town" is a mustsee creative collaboration. You'll need to canvas the city, though—the donkeys will be placed in publicly accessible spots like the Art Museum and Franklin Square, making it an ideal itinerary for visitors (and residents who need a refresher). To up the ante on your art tour, use the Scavify app to locate all of the donkeys and earn sweet prizes.

PRESIDENTIAL **ARCHIVES**

Library Company of Philadelphia will feature WRITINGS, PHOTOGRAPHS AND **ARTIFACTS** from its personal collection, including a curated exhibit showcasing a life mask of George Washington, death mask of Abraham Lincoln, and rare books, graphics and manuscripts about our nation's founding, women in American politics and 19th-century African-American political conventions. Continue to the **Historical Society of Pennsylvania** for "Founding documents," where they've culled treasured records like the Constitution of the National Woman Suffrage Association.

POLITICS AND YOU!

Located in Hall F of the Pennsylvania Convention Center, families are invited to participate in interactive experiences and POLITICAL FUN AND GAMES FOR CHILDREN in an area called Future Leaders Zone. In Old City, the **National Liberty Museum** will host "FIRST FAMILIES" with items and images from 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue's most prominent residents, including special programs provided by the Rendell Center for Civic Engagement, dresses from First Ladies and a FIRST FAMILY PHOTO EXHIBIT, presented by National Geographic.

PHILADELPHIA **& THE PRESIDENCY**

Whether you're a Philly resident or visiting from the 'burbs, this PoliticalFest event is an essential for White House wizzes. The Philadelphia History Museum at the Atwater Kent will showcase PHILADELPHIA'S HISTORY WITH THE PRESIDENCY, including a photo opportunity for attendees to be a part of a whistle stop campaign tour. (Not a poli sci major? A 'whistle stop' refers to a style of campaigning popularized by Truman-brief appearances and speeches typically held at train stations.)

HEADED TO THE WHITE HOUSE

Catch this feature exhibition at the National **Constitution Center for** "Political Theater," which will include political feud with festival attendees, a political trivia media tournament, special political games with politicans, rare screenings of political speeches and live celebrity interviews. The center will also incorporate its permanent exhibits into the weeklong festivities. Afterward, visit "SWEEP THE COUN-TRY: POLITICAL CONVENTIONS IN PHILADELPHIA," the Heritage Center at the Union League's deep dive into the 11 political conventions held in Philadelphia.

Tickets are valid for all six days and include access to a dedicated **Philly PHLASH** bus loop.

Documents, Artifacts and Photo Ops You Can't Miss at PoliticalFest

OR

How to impress your friends and family with the very best in nonpartisan museum miscellany. (You know, if they're impressed by that sort of thing.)

Skip the trip to Washington, DC and swing by "Politics and You!" inside the Pennsylvania Convention Center to take an awesome photo inside replicas of the OVAL OFFICE, presented by Facebook, and an AIR FORCE ONE FUSELAGE.

Thought President Barack Obama's minimalist, gilded WHITE HOUSE CHINA was luxe? Wait until you see the tableware linked to George Washington at the "First Families" exhibit at the National Liberty Museum.

The National Constitution Center is pulling out all the stops, granting access to its main exhibit "The Story of We the People," feature exhibit "Headed to the White House," and newly upgraded "Freedom Rising." Artifacts with mainstream appeal include FRANKLIN ROOSEVELT'S FEDORA (a sartorial feat, to be sure) and ABRAHAM LINCOLN'S ONLY KNOWN SIGNATURE from the day of his Gettysburg Address.

While you're visiting the nearby "Founding Documents" exhibit at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania, don't miss a chance to see an EMANCIPATION PROCLAMATION LITHOGRAPH, a published copy of the ARTICLES OF CONFEDERATION in English and in German, and samples of CONTINENTAL CURRENCY.

The Historical Society of Pennsylvania is also home to the first draft of the UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION and an original printer's proof of the DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE.

Scour "First Families" at the National Liberty Museum to find a prized collection of JOHNSTON & MURPHY SHOES WORN by previous presidents, including Abraham Lincoln and John F. Kennedy.

Keep your camera ready for quirky relics like STAR- AND ELEPHANT-SHAPED KRAFT MACARONI AND CHEESE courtesy of the Heritage Center at the Union League's exhibit "Sweep the Country: Political Conventions in Philadelphia."

Participate in "Political Theater" at the National Constitution Center where politicians, media and attendees will get to test their political knowledge with political gaming. Plus, guests can sit in on CELEBRITY INTERVIEWS and take in RARE SCREENINGS OF FAMOUS POLITICAL SPEECHES.

Explore C-SPAN's "American Presidents" exhibit inside the Pennsylvania Convention Center; it brings to life the nation's 43 presidents through ONE-OF-A-KIND OIL PORTRAITS along with biographies, photographs, interactive video and audio recordings.

Last, don't miss C-SPAN'S EDUCATIONAL BUS outside the National Constitution Center, where you can tour the mobile interactive learning center and learn more about C-SPAN'S 2016 campaign coverage.
